February is “World Understanding Month”

I was really struggling to think of what to write for this weeks bulletin- I then found this article on my big pond home page and it made me stop and think yet again “how lucky we are to live in such a wonderfully safe country”

An overcrowded hospital in Sri Lanka's battle zone - where many patients have been killed in the past day - has been shelled again, the United Nations says.

Aid agencies have condemned the attacks which in one case hit a paediatric unit in the last functioning medical facility in the war-torn area.

Three artillery shells hit the hospital on Sunday, and at least two more hit the unit on Monday.

Staff working for the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) who are in the hospital say at least 12 people have been killed and many more wounded.

The four-year-old daughter of one of the UN members of staff was among those hurt by the shelling.

One text message from a UN worker in the hospital said: 'Women and kids wards shelled. God, no words. Still counting the dead bodies.'

The hospital was already full of 500 wounded patients with more injured continuing to arrive.

National Immunization Day in Nigeria.

My fellow Rotarians, I am in the process of planning a NID in Nigeria and invite Rotarians whom wish to encounter a hands on experience of a life time, immunizing the children of Nigeria against Polio.
This is our promise to the children of the world, a world with out Polio.

I'm in touch with a PDG from District 9110 and the Rotarians from the Rotary Club of Vitoria Island East, whom will assist our team in planning and implementing the NID.

I have been assured that at all times there will be no safety issues, as our team will not be exposed to any volatile areas. Remembering that the Nigerians know of Rotary and of the great work we do eradicating Polio, and they all want the same as we do, to see their children are protected against the scourge of Polio.

Nigeria accounts for 79% of the global wild Poliovirus type 1 and 10% of the wild Poliovirus type 3 cases. Nigeria accounts for 90% of all Polio cases in Africa.

Polio is a **PAIN** to the children of the world and it is in **Pakistan, Afghanistan, India, Nigeria.**

The dates for the NID are 21st to the 24th of March 2009, the total time we will be away will be decided by the team. I would expect it to be 10 days in Nigeria.
Home stay could be possible but if not, they will negotiate good rates for us in suitable hotels.
Internal transport will be provided by the Rotarians.

I have received cost's on flights with Emirates, from Perth / Dubai to Lagos and return at \$4,100 each person.

Glenys and I have lead several teams away, and have found that 20 Rotarians is a better number to travel with, therefore we are after 9 couples to travel with us.
