CLUB NOMINATIONS FOR DISTRICT GOVERNOR 2010-11

The Board of the Rotary Club of Hannans-Kalgoorlie has been asked to consider nominating a qualified member of our Club to be a candidate for District Governor 2010-11

If you are interested in nominating and meet the Qualifications for nomination as listed below please see President Anne for a nomination Form

Qualification for nomination: At the time of selection, a governor nominee must:

- Be a member of in good standing of a functioning club in the district
- Have full qualifications for membership in the strict application of the club membership provisions, and the integrity of the Rotarian's classification must be without question.
- Have served as President of a club for a full term or be a charter president of a club having served the full term from the date of the charter to 30 June, provided that this period is for at least six months
- Demonstrate willingness, commitment, and ability, physically and otherwise, to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of the office of governor as provided in RI By laws section 15.090
- Demonstrate knowledge of the qualifications, duties, and responsibilities of governor as prescribed in the RI Bylaws, and submit to RI, through the General Secretary, a signed statement acknowledging a clear understanding of them. This statement shall also confirm that the Rotarian is qualified for the office of governor and willing and able to assume the duties and responsibilities of the office and to perform them.

Qualification for nomination:

- In addition to the qualifications of governor-nominee, a governor, at the time of taking office, must have completed seven years of membership in one or more clubs and have attended Governor-elect training seminar and International Assembly.

At this stage Council will:
Install reticulation to the area to be grassed.
Install swing set
Install halfcourt basket ball court

There is a garden bed on the bank that needs planting. There will be 300 plants to be planted. These will be provided by Council. As part of our commitment to Peace Park we will plant these plants and install the drippers in the appropriate places. The main reticulation will be in place ready for us.

What will be required on behalf of Rotarians is for provision of shovels, metal rakes, gloves for planting. Council will arrange for the Dingo to be on site for spreading of mulch as planting proceeds over the site and for additional hands on board for setting out the like.

Council will also arrange for installation of reticulation to the garden area prior to the date and for delivery of mulch.

In regard to the fitness course, Council will ensure delivery this financial year; however installation will have to be undertaken following grassing of the relevant area.
